Too Many Packs can be a Pain

Dear Aunt Bingo:

This past year I decided I was going to make a change in how many packs I play at Bingo.

The obvious logic (which you have covered many times in your excellent column) is that the more cards you play, the better your odds.

I generally agree with this up to a point—that point being that there are only so many packs a person can handle, and if they go beyond that number they will (1) make mistakes by dabbing the wrong numbers or missing called numbers altogether, and/or (2) be able to keep up but be so stressed out in doing so that they are a bundle of nerves and have absolutely no fun at the Bingo tables.

For some time I was playing with a large number of packs and could keep up with the caller no problem, but on the following day found that my body ached and I would sometimes have a headache—I assumed from the position in which I sat and all the fast eye movement.

Eventually I decided it was too much; I reduced the number of packs I play and took the extra time I used to spend scanning and dabbing to rest my arms, stretch my back and neck, and relax my eyes.

It made a huge difference in how I felt while I played and especially the next day.

It wasn’t easy making this change, especially when I saw other players around me with two, three or more packs than I had. And on occasion (usually when I feel extra lucky) I still will bump up the number of packs without any physical trouble the next day, but not push it.

Also, because I am now avoiding the aches and pains, I don’t need as much time to “rest up” between Bingo trips and actually play more often and spend about the same amount of money. This has given me the opportunity to try some other, new Bingo halls I’ve seen in your newspaper, which has been fun.

Another part of my thinking on this is that I noticed that when I have a good night, the winning seems to come from one or two of the packs, while the others are weak losers for the entire session. It got me wondering if the “more packs = better odds” theory really is true, when in fact you are investing in several packs which turn out to be a complete waste of time, money and energy.

Dear Alise:

If you found yourself with a host of aches and pains after a Bingo outing, you were wise to examine what might be causing your discomfort and make the necessary adjustments to your “Bingo Lifestyle.”

Over the years I’ve done the same thing—like bringing a seat cushion as protection against unfriendly folding chairs and getting up and walking around between sessions to stretch my muscles and get the blood flowing.

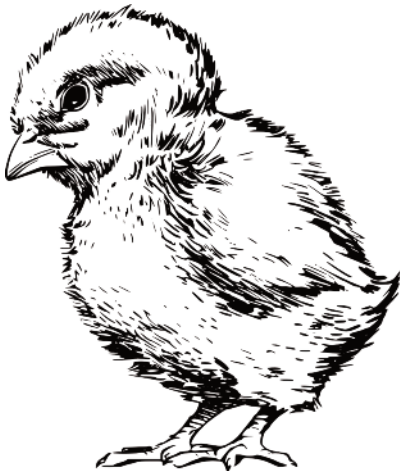
I learned long ago what my limit is with Bingo packs and play accordingly. Sometimes I’ll go with one or two more or less, depending on how I feel that particular day. I never want Bingo-playing to be a chore.

I understand what you are saying about one or two packs getting more action than the others and that it might make sense to play fewer because of it. But there may be a hitch in that logic.

Some players could argue that the only way to get the strong packs is by buying more total packs. If you only buy one or two, they both could be stinkers. But get three or four, and you just doubled your chances of getting a winning pack.

Biggest Wave in the World

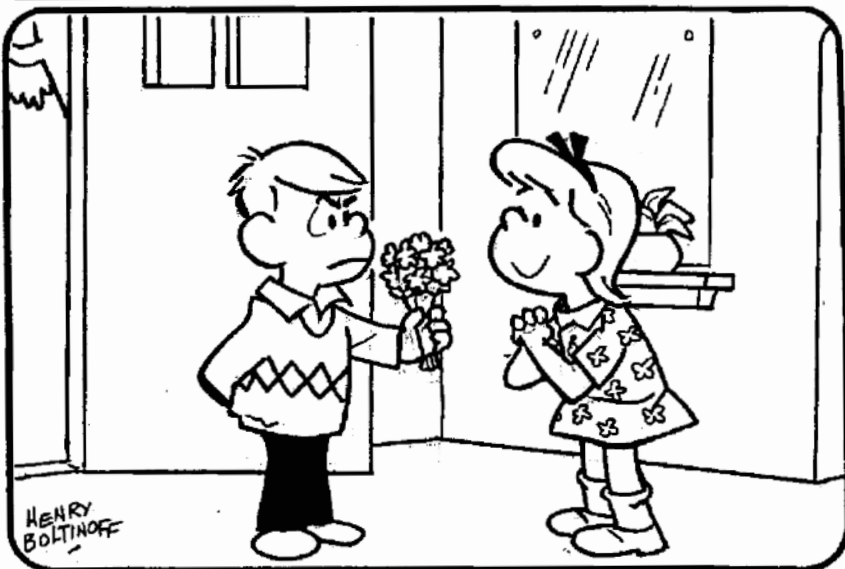
Dear Dream Catcher

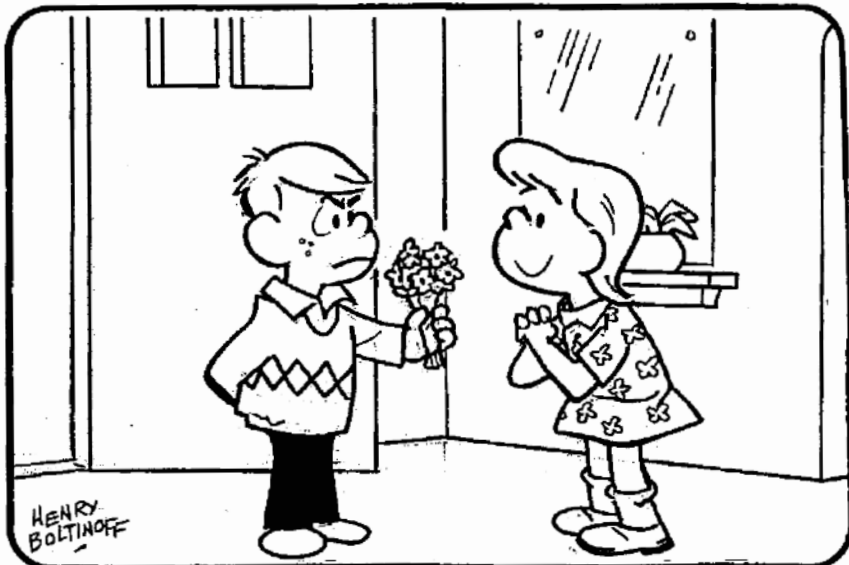

Ellen DeGeneres Scratchers Investigated

California Giveaway

A studio audience giveaway of California Lottery scratch-off tickets on *The Ellen DeGeneres Show* is now under investigation following claims by whistleblowers that the prize constituted a misuse of funds. Each audience member received a \$500 bundle of Scratchers with a combined face value of more than \$200,000. The TV event reportedly was just the latest in what has been alleged as wasteful spending, improper gifts and nepotism at the California Lottery, and concerns that not enough of the agency's income is going to where it is intended: education. The whistleblower complaint was sent to the state auditor and the governor by a group of lottery employees who claimed that some gift packs that did not go to the audience were improperly left with show staff. The lottery claims that giving away the Scratchers tickets was done to create positive publicity for the games, with the goal of increasing sales.

Lotto in Alaska?

Alaska Gov. Mike Dunleavy has introduced legislation in support of a state lottery to offset budget pressures created by the drop in the price of oil, one of Alaska's chief sources of revenue. The administration estimates that a basic draw game could generate up \$10 million a year. That number would likely grow if additional lottery games were added. The proposal has received mixed reviews: while lawmakers welcome new sources of revenue, some complain that a lottery should not be part of a sound fiscal plan. Alaska is one of only a handful of states that still does not offer a lottery. The state does permit charitable gaming, such as Bingo.

Fast Play Begins in Maryland

The Maryland Lottery has introduced a new category of "scratch-less" instant game. Fast Play games are instant tickets that are printed by lottery terminals and self-service vending machines, just like draw game tickets. But players find out instantly if they've won, with no scratching or waiting days for a drawing. Like scratch-offs, the new games come in a variety of prices

and play styles, each with its own prize structure. Prizes range from up to \$1,000 for \$1 games to up to \$100,000 for \$10 games. Fast Play games are currently offered in 19 states.

Nebraska Debates Winner Anonymity

Winners of any prize in the Nebraska Lottery are required by law to allow their names and other details be made public. Legislation has now been introduced to protect the privacy of players who win \$300,000 or more by remaining anonymous, blocking their names from being released by creating a new exemption to the Nebraska Public Records laws. Currently, seven states allow for total anonymity for lottery winners. Arizona gives privacy to winners of \$100,000 or more, Georgia keeps the names of those who win more than \$250,000 private, and Virginia protects the identities of winners who collect more than \$10 million. Nebraska print and broadcast media outlets oppose the legislation, noting that knowing the winners maintains transparency and integrity in the state's lottery games.

Less Money Despite Social Security Increase

I'll be worse off financially this year, despite the Social Security increase we just received. I won't be the only one.

For the average recipient who receives \$1,460 per month, that 1.6% equates to a gain of \$23.36 per month. Medicare went up \$9.10 to \$144.60, so that drops the extra cash to \$14.26.

Except my Medicare supplement went up \$42 and the drug plan went up as well. Rent went up \$20 per month, justified by management with the "big increase" in Social Security we all got.

With so many of us in the same situation, we need to think of ways to save money:

If you take a daily newspaper and pay for it by the month, calculate whether you'll save money if you pay for it by the year. If you have a tablet, ask if they offer a digital subscription at a lower rate. Making yearly payments might also work for your car or homeowner insurance.

Call the local food bank about getting free food. Don't worry about running into someone you know. Just make the call. Whatever you get from them you won't have to buy at the store.

Check into "senior helper" groups in your area. These are people who volunteer to take care of home repairs for free, instead of paying a plumber \$150 per hour.

If you have a credit card, make payments on time. Check AARP's member discounts. Buy at Goodwill. Ask for lower prices. Buy generic groceries. Get serious about clipping coupons. Ask about senior discount day.

If you love movies, consider that the price of Netflix for one month is the same as seeing one movie at a theater.

Check online for a FreeCycle in your area (freecycle.org) and get things you need or want for free.

And always ask for your senior discount.

How Bad Is Drinking a Bottle of Wine

DEAR DR. ROACH: I know drinking a bottle of wine isn't good for me, but is it really that bad? I'm a 74-year-old female in excellent health who stays active and enjoys relaxing with wine — before, during and after dinner. I seriously want to know if I'm really harming myself with this habit. — *N.R.*

ANSWER: A bottle of wine is indeed more than is recommended daily. For women, the recommendation is one glass of wine with meals. A bottle of wine contains five glasses. This amount of alcohol is thought to increase overall risk of death by about 30 percent, mostly from accidents, kidney and liver disease and congestive heart failure. There is fairly strong evidence that this much alcohol also increases risk of developing dementia. Alcohol may have a greater effect on older women, because at age 74, your liver probably does not work as well as it did when you were 20.

Put another way, your current risk of death due to the alcohol is closer to that of an 80-year-old than that of a 74-year-old, roughly speaking. Cutting down on alcohol now stops further damage and allows your body to heal itself, to some extent.

I hope I have convinced you that from your health standpoint, five glasses of wine is far too much, and I would really encourage you to stay below two glasses of wine a day.

Q: I received a puppy last fall from a friend whose dog had a surprise litter. “Tara” is a super-cute girl of unknown breed, very smart and growing fast. I haven't taken her to the veterinarian yet, but I know she needs to be spayed. When will it be too late to get her fixed?

A: It's never too late to spay or neuter a pet, but the veterinarian will recommend that the procedure be done soon. Shelter pups are often neutered as young as eight weeks, but with dogs already in a home, vets sometimes prefer to wait a few months until they've developed more. This helps prevent potential problems of early spaying like urinary incontinence, hip dysplasia and even cancer when a dog is older.

You should take Tara into the vet as soon as possible anyway. She needs to start getting some key vaccinations that will keep her healthy as she grows up. She shouldn't be around other puppies until she's had her first few rounds of shots.

Some of those vaccinations are required by your city and state, and she will need to be licensed — all of which the vet can get you set up with. If you're worried about the cost, check around with different veterinary practices to see if they have introductory specials for new pet owners that include a checkup, core vaccinations and the spaying procedure.

Ellen DeGeneres Scratchers Investigated

California Giveaway

A studio audience giveaway of California Lottery scratch-off tickets on *The Ellen DeGeneres Show* is now under investigation following claims by whistleblowers that the prize constituted a misuse of funds. Each audience member received a \$500 bundle of Scratchers with a combined face value of more than \$200,000. The TV event reportedly was just the latest in what has been alleged as wasteful spending, improper gifts and nepotism at the California Lottery, and concerns that not enough of the agency's income is going to where it is intended: education. The whistleblower complaint was sent to the state auditor and the governor by a group of lottery employees who claimed that some gift packs that did not go to the audience were improperly left with show staff. The lottery claims that giving away the Scratchers tickets was done to create positive publicity for the games, with the goal of increasing sales.

Lotto in Alaska?

Alaska Gov. Mike Dunleavy has introduced legislation in support of a state lottery to offset budget pressures created by the drop in the price of oil, one of Alaska's chief sources of revenue. The administration estimates that a basic draw game could generate up \$10 million a year. That number would likely grow if additional lottery games were added. The proposal has received mixed reviews: while lawmakers welcome new sources of revenue, some complain that a lottery should not be part of a sound fiscal plan. Alaska is one of only a handful of states that still does not offer a lottery. The state does permit charitable gaming, such as Bingo.

Fast Play Begins in Maryland

The Maryland Lottery has introduced a new category of “scratchless” instant game. Fast Play games are instant tickets that are printed by lottery terminals and self-service vending machines, just like draw game tickets. But players find out instantly if they've won, with no scratching or waiting days for a drawing. Like scratch-offs, the new games come in a variety of prices and play styles, each with its own prize structure. Prizes range from up to \$1,000 for \$1 games to up to \$100,000 for \$10 games. Fast Play games are currently offered in 19 states.

Nebraska Debates Winner Anonymity

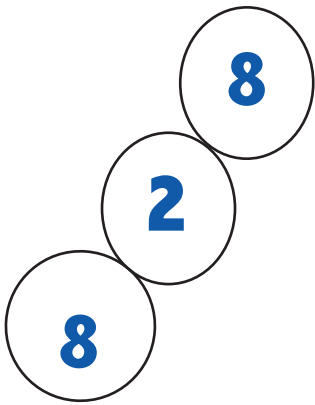
Winners of any prize in the Nebraska Lottery are required by law to allow their names and other details be made public. Legislation has now been introduced to protect the privacy of players who win \$300,000 or more by remaining anonymous, blocking their names from being released by creating a new exemption to the Nebraska Public Records laws. Currently, seven states allow for total anonymity for lottery winners. Arizona gives privacy to winners of \$100,000 or more, Georgia keeps the names of those who win more than \$250,000 private, and Virginia protects the identities of winners who collect more than \$10 million. Nebraska print and broadcast media outlets oppose the legislation, noting that knowing the winners maintains transparency and integrity in the state's lottery games.

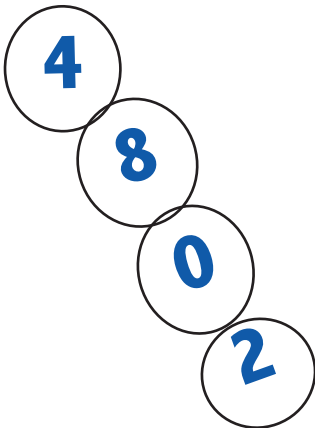

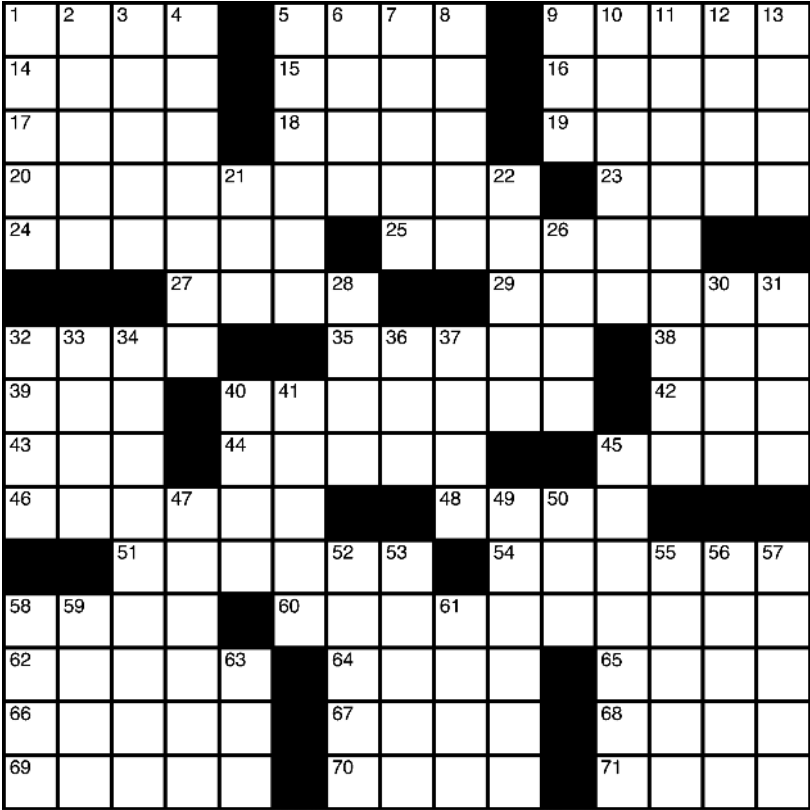

NEVADA HAPPENINGS

B-AND-B's THRIVE IN VEGAS AREA

A new report shows more than 882,000 home-share rentals in Clark County last year. The people who rented out their homes earned more than \$138 million. That's up 38% over the \$100 million in 2018. All this comes at the same time as a concerted crackdown on short-term rentals in unincorporated Clark County and some restrictions in the cities of Las Vegas and Henderson. According to published reports, the county has six staff members dedicated to cracking down on illegal short-term rentals. It is estimated that each year B-and-B's drain away about \$150-million from Strip properties.

ISN'T IT ROMANTIC?

A report from Open Table, the world's leading provider of online restaurant reservations, recently publishes a list of the 100 Most Romantic Restaurants in America. The list is devised from more than 80-million diner reviews of more than 30,000 restaurants across all 50 states and Washington, DC. Only one on the 100-list is in Las Vegas: Sinatra at the Wynn.

SUPER BOWL NUMBERS

According to the Nevada Gaming Control Board, the first set of figures released on the most recent Super Bowl shows that nearly \$155-million was wagered in the Silver state. There are 190 sports books in the state that participated in this year's wagering. According to the board, the organization's chairwoman, Becky Harris, noted, "Unaudited figures show a sports book win of \$18,774,148 was recorded on wagers totaling \$154,679,241."

NEON FREEWAY

The people who manage traffic patterns in and around Las Vegas recently turned on a series of digital traffic signs on a busy tourist interstate, between Valley View and Las Vegas Boulevard. The signs are part of a one-billion-dollar project called the Neon Freeway. When finished, the plan is to use the signs to regulate speeds and lanes when something goes wrong. Veterans Post



Navigating the Medical Care Maze

It's easy to get lost in the shuffle of medical care. When something is wrong, you need to know what it is, and quickly. That didn't happen with a veteran in New York.

For that veteran there was a delay in finding out about abnormal test results. Policies say that if the results require intervention or action, the patient needs to hear from the ordering provider in seven days. If that provider isn't available, each medical facility must have a surrogate, someone charged with handling the test results. In other words, the results just don't get lost somewhere and forgotten.

For the veteran above, there was a 36-day delay. The person who ran the tests quickly passed along the results to the surrogate provider... who sat on them for 28 days. After handing them off to the next in line in the hierarchy (the chief of staff), the veteran was finally notified eight additional days later.

In another case there was a problem with ambulance transport. A provider told paramedics to transport a veteran to a certain civilian hospital because the closest civilian hospital didn't have the proper equipment. The doctor personally called the hospital and verified that information. The paramedics, however, decided to take the patient to the closest civilian hospital. They later had to pick up the veteran and take him to the correct hospital.

This leaves it to you, the patient, to ask questions. Specifically you want to know: When will the medical test results be ready? Who will have those results? Get the name and phone number. If
